Mirjam is a member of the Advisory Board at CANactions School for Urban studies where she has been teaching since 2015 and curated the 'Homes for Tomorrow' program. Since 2022, she engages for the Ro3kvit coalition for Ukraine, where she has researched on circular reconstruction for post war Ukraine.
