He holds a Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Architectural Science (2011) and a Bachelor of Architecture (BArch) (2013) from University College Dublin (UCD). He has been a registered architect with the Colegio Oficial de Arquitectos de Galicia (COAG, Reg. No. 4688) since 2015.

In October 2013, he joined the Office of Architecture in Barcelona (OAB), where he contributed to diverse designs and international competitions. Notable projects included the competition for the new Camp Nou stadium and a residential complex in Bodrum (Turkey), alongside work spanning France, the Czech Republic, Morocco, China, Israel, Kazakhstan, Italy, and Chile.

In 2019, he moved to Urban Agency in Dublin. His responsibilities included various office projects in Ireland, a 5-star hotel in Rabat (Morocco), and involvement in significant masterplan projects, such as the large-scale Cherrywood development in Dublin, currently under construction.

He co-founded vi17 Arquitectura in Galicia, Spain, with Diego Díaz in 2020. The practice has achieved significant recognition, winning two major competitions currently under development: the National Package Center in Calahorra (awarded 2022) and the Redevelopment of Paseo Sarasate and Adjacent Streets in Pamplona (awarded 2024). Additional accolades include two Special Mentions in European Norway, recognition in Estonian competitions, and mentions in various Spanish competitions.

In 2024, he obtained an MArch Master's degree in Technological Innovation from the Universitat Politècnica de Catalunya (UPC) in Barcelona, with the thesis titled "*Generative tools in architecture: Critical analysis and real-world project applications*".
